PUPPY DOG (1)

1st Blackburn-Bennett & Wilberg's Coralwood Kanix Mr T, 6 months o/w of quality, excellent skull, but like the majority could have more dish, quality bone & feet, well balanced outline, plenty of angulation, front action a little high stepping in profile but dead true coming on, slightly close going away. Hope he has stopped growing. Standing he looked a picture despite his youth. RCC & BP.

JUNIOR DOG (4)

1st Booth's Kanix Garfunkel, 12 months b/w who was the only dog in the class who moved correctly. Rather plain head, well balanced outline, moderate angles;

2nd Westron's Tenshilling Makin Whoopee at Aurichalcum, 14 months o/w, much more the type I prefer especially in head & he has better forechest than 1. He is very exuberant & tended to throw his front about badly. When he settles could be an interesting prospect;

3rd Tobin & Moss' Davigdor Rough And Tumble.

GRADUATE DOG (2)

1st Dodds' Raigmore Light Up The Sky for Lyncarda, o/w in excellent condition, quite good outline, plain head with no dish. Movement could be better in front;

2nd Mackay's Keepersfield Star Gazer, o/w in lean hard condition, again no dish & plain head, preferred tail carriage of 1 but movement was on a par.

POST GRADUATE DOG (3)

1st Martin's Sunhouse Anything Goes, well up to size b/w who won on movement. Adequate head, good angles throughout, well muscled, covers the ground well with good reach & drive & dead true up & down; 2nd O'Driscoll's Gartarry Moonlight Flit to Fowington, o/w, out of a smaller mould but shapely & with appealing expression. Goes away dead true but comes on sloppily. In profile could not match the scope of 1;

3rd Bell's Crookrise The Medlar at Owlspoint.

LIMIT DOG (4) Disappointing class with not one great mover

1st Whitham's Moordale Maritime at Sedgekirk, b/w of moderate type who picked his forefeet up less than the others. Adequate head, hard condition;

2nd Wood's Wilchrimane Let's Boogie at Penbro, heavier built b/w with a little more head type than 1 but more upright through the front & hackneys badly on the move; 3rd Hall's Gartarry Peregrine.

OPEN DOG (3)

1st Blackburn-Bennett's Sh Ch Kiswahili Martin at Kanix, fully mature o/w of excellent overall type, good enough head & expression, curvy outline, very well conditioned & muscled. I have never liked his front movement particularly but he makes the best of himself on the go around & in this entry of males he had no serious competition on overall merit. CC. It is interesting to see that he sired the winners of the BCC & RDCC;

2nd Oliveira & Silva's Pt Ch Oliver do Vale Carvoieiro, o/w of good basic type but not the condition or angles of 1 & even less coordinated in front;

3rd Rossiter, Fox & Mosedale's Am Ch Marsuz Alydar I Like It Love It at Solivia.

PUPPY BITCH (6)

1st Westron's Aurichalcum Elle Fyre, 6 months o/w, rather overawed but with a definite look of class & in beautiful bloom. Feminine head which could have a little more depth, moderate angles, did just about enough on the move;

2nd Klein-Woolthuis' Tenshilling Take It All to Haxalgate, good headed 11 months b/w, much more forward than 1 & would have won the class but she refused to use her tail at all - a pity as she is shapely & has lots to like;

3rd Robertson's Wynbury Thomasina by Fleurfield.

JUNIOR BITCH (4)

1st Martin's Shadesett Serendipity at Sunhouse, strongly made 12 months o/w of excellent overall type & shape. Quality head that could still have more dish but has much more Pointer expression than the more majority, nicely boned & ribbed with good angles & curves. Excellent neck, topline & overall balance, moved with power & relative accuracy, carrying herself typically & with style. CC & BOB;

2nd McGilp's Ridanflight Rhosyn, another good mover of 14 months but not the head qualities of 1. Clean, curvy outline, covered the ground with ease;

3rd Bell's Ridanflight Runedd with Balintyne.

GRADUATE BITCH (2)

1st Hall's Gartarry New Moon, o/w with appealing head & expression, nicely balanced curvy outline with moderate angles. Moved with some conviction;

2nd Hewitt's Sunhouse As You Like It, b/w with adequate head, a little severe in underline & not the rear angulation of 1. Goes away much better than she comes on.

POST GRADUATE BITCH (3)

1st Barford & Booth's Kanix Calypso by Kiswahili, o/w with quite pleasing head, nicely balanced outline with optimum angles, in fit hard condition, moved steadily;

2nd Ward's Adventures of Isabel to Jakobstown, not the head of 1 but this b/w moved well in profile though better behind than in front. Good overall balance;

3rd Jones & Hinton's Pippalee Georgia by Fleurfield.

LIMIT BITCH (6)

1st Woods' Wilchrimane Let's Dance at Penbro, lower stationed than the other bitches in the class but she has a decent head & moves so soundly, up, down & around which is obviously becoming a rarity. Fair powers around using her tail & was in good hard nick. Although she was a little out of type with my other main winners she won the RCC on her exceptional movement & wonderful condition;

2nd Evans & Pavey's Joneva Hazy Dazy Dream, o/w more rangy than 1 & not quite her depth of muzzle. Not as relaxed as 1 or as keen to move out & could be a little tidier in front but she still has a basic type about her;

3rd Barford & Booth's Kiswahili You Live In Me for Protanto.

OPEN BITCH (3)

1st Blackburn-Bennett's Sh Ch Kanix Chilli, mature o/w who won on her general outline & her profile movement. Not the expression I look for & could be cleaner coming on;

2nd Wilkinson's Sh Ch Flinthill Forget Me Not, b/w of more appealing general type & shape but not as collected as 1 up & down, though she covers the ground well in profile;

3rd Fairbairn & Madigan's Misperros Jumanji of Carmelfair.
