

East of England Agricultural Society Championship Show

Friday 4th July 1914

Lovely entry both numerically and in quality. Limit Dog and Limit Bitch saw many good dogs going cardless. The 'age' classes are always a challenge as they are at all stages of immaturity. Profile movement on the whole was excellent. Some untidy movement coming and going. Not so many high tails which has got to be a good thing. It is such an ugly fault completely spoiling the flowing lines of the breed when watching profile movement. I found more quality than when I last judged.

MINOR PUPPY DOG (2) –

1st Siddle's Wilchrimane C'mon Norbert. 7 month o/w. Beautiful head and expression although a shade short in muzzle at the moment. Well angulated fore and aft. Deep brisket. Good ribcage. Well boned legs. Low set hocks. Moved steadily.

2nd Wilcox' Wilchrimane Bold Move for Merynjen. O/w litter brother to above. Preferred the reach of neck on this boy but plainer in head than above, and he was more erratic on the move. Another well boned puppy. Good feet and lengthy sloping pasterns.

PUPPY DOG (6) –

1st Perkins' Kanix Joker of Brent. 11 months. Lovely well balanced b/w. Excellent shape being well angulated front and rear, long neck, good firm topline, correct tail set, well sprung ribs with depth to brisket. Low set hocks, good feet and pasterns. Beautiful head and expression with neat fine leathers. Easy mover. Best Puppy.

2nd Tibbs' Raigmore Astronomer Royal. 9 month o/w with a stunning outline. Same remarks apply as above although this boy has more elegance. He has lots of maturing to do as he should at this age. His profile movement, and reach of stride are textbook. Should trouble the best when fully mature.

3rd Hazeltine's Hookwood By George. 11 month o/w. Made from a larger mould than those above and not the work in head but nevertheless a well constructed puppy. Excellent angles front and rear. Well muscled hindquarters, good width to thigh, low set hocks. Good feet and pasterns. Lovely profile movement.

JUNIOR DOG (6) –

Not much to choose between first and second here.

1st Stilgoe's Teisgol I Am the One and Only. 12 month b/w. Just preferred the fine chiselling in head of this boy. Good reach of neck, body a series of graceful curves. Correct topline. Tail carried straight off the back. Lovely feet and pasterns, low set hocks. Lovely profile movement. Just needs to tighten up coming and going.

2nd Theobald, Phillips & Westaway's Penwest Pallaton. 17 month b/w. These two will change places many times I'm sure. Another with correct footfall in profile movement. Super neck and topline with all the desired curves, and tail coming straight off the back. Liked him.

3rd Timothy's Anniezu Magic Moments. 14 month o/w. Another nice youngster. Close up to those above. Nicely constructed. Moved well.

YEARLING DOG (6) –

- 1st Stilgoe's Teisgol I Am the One and Only.
- 2nd Theobald, Phillips & Westaway's Penwest Pallaton.
- 3rd Timothy's Anniezu Magic Moments.

GRADUATE DOG (5) –

- 1st Smith's Fydal Ace. Love this elegant b/w. He flows from nose to tail with curvaceous lines. Lovely head and expression, neat fine leathers, long neck. Excellent feet and pasterns. Lashes his tail beautifully on the move. Just needs maturity to complete the picture.
- 2nd Wall's Ansona Isaac Newton. Quality b/w. Close up to first but threw it away by not co-operating on the move. He has a nice head and expression, correct ears. Excellent body shape. Well boned legs, good feet and pasterns. Liked him.
- 3rd Anderson Rowell's Daledancer Silver Fame. Very nice o/w. Liked his head & eye. Well angulated shoulder and upper arm. Deep brisket with well sprung rib. Not quite the hindquarters of those above and does tend to carry tail a little high.

POST GRADUATE DOG (5) –

- 1st Rayner, Spinks & Pringle's Tenshilling It's Now or Never at Spinray. This o/w has matured a lot since I last saw him. Very nice head and expression. Good reach of neck into well laid shoulders. Super depth and spring of rib. Gently sloping topline with good bend of stifle and low set hocks. Neat tail set on well. Moved well.
- 2nd Osman's Wilchrimane Diamond Geezer at Marissolo. This b/w was close up to one. Nice head and expressive eyes. Liked his front assembly, feet and pasterns. Good depth and spring of rib. Just a shade steep in croup.
- 3rd Smith's Lypal Deeply Dippy. Very sound o/w. Not the head of those above. Well shaped body with correct angulations. Neat tail set on well. Top size for me. Moved well.

LIMIT DOG (15) –

What a class! I was really splitting hairs here.

- 1st Dodds' Raigmore Light Up the Sky for Lyncarda. Beautiful o/w. Super well chiselled head and expressive eyes. Neat fine leathers. He has flowing lines all through from his arched neck and well angulated forequarters to his well turned stifle with width of thigh and low set hocks. Super topline and lovely beesting tail set on correctly. Shown in immaculate condition he powered round the ring with an easy ground covering stride. Close up for top honours.
- 2nd Harrison's Millpoint Heat Wave. Impressive b/w with little to fault. I judged him as a puppy giving him Best Puppy Dog and my opinion of him hasn't changed. He is such a well balanced dog with loving flowing lines and good driving movement with an easy stride. Beautiful head and eye with lovely reach of neck into well angulated forequarters, matched by super sweep of stifle and low set hocks. Shown in tip top condition.
- 3rd Watkins & Davies' Hurwyn Law N Order. B/w. Another favourite of mine. So well balanced with lovely head and eye. Flowing lines all through. Shown in superb condition. Just not the profile movement of 1st and 2nd. This class gave me a real headache as I would have liked 6 or 7 first prize cards.

OPEN DOG (8) –

1st Theobald's Sh.Ch. Tycarreg Strangely Familyr. My star of the day. Beautiful b/w now in his prime. He has a lovely well moulded head, gorgeous expressive eye, neat fine leathers set on high. Shapely body with angles all in the right places. I love his carriage on the move and his easy action with reach and drive which took him to the CC & BOB. He then went on to take Group 2. Congratulations to his owner, and to his handler.

2nd Adams' Sh.Ch. Ansona Simple Simon. Built on racier lines than above. Pleasing head and expression. High set fine leathers. Long neck. Stunning outline of graceful curves. Moved well with lovely tail carriage. Awarded him RCC last time I judged and it was another RCC today.

3rd O'Neill's Hurwyn Some Might Say. Completed a trio of quality b/w males. Clean lines with no exaggerations. Love his head and expression. Shown in lovely bloom.

MINOR PUPPY BITCH (7) –

1st Brooksmith's Medogold Kiss N'Tell. 8 month l/w. Very well balanced with a lovely shape. Super spring of rib and depth. Excellent angulation fore and aft with sweep of stifle and width of thigh. Low set hocks. Excellent feet and pasterns. Moved well.

2nd Gordon's Hawkfield Pride N Prejudice. 8 month solid black built on racier lines than above and so will take longer to mature. Liked her feminine head with correct leathers. Lovely expressive eye. Long neck flowing into well angled forequarters. Good strong topline. Well muscled hindquarters. Low set hocks. A little erratic on the move but profile movement was excellent when she settled into her stride.

3rd MacManus' Crookrise Diva by Luneville. Sweet b/w of 8 months. Liked her head and expression. Well balanced in body. Decent reach of neck. Needs time, and sadly carried tail too high.

PUPPY BITCH (10) –

1st Barker's Flinthill Sunshine Suzy. Ultra feminine 10 month o/w. Immature as yet, and so naughty, but her true breed type shines through. Very pretty head and expression. Long neck. Excellent depth for her age. Well angled fore and aft. Good feet and pasterns. Moved well when settled. Just preferred her femininity to 2nd. Best Puppy Bitch.

2nd Brooksmith's Medogold Kiss N'Tell.

3rd Wilkinson's Stocksfell Remember Me. Feminine 10 month b/w. Liked her head and eye. Fine leathers. Nicely angulated. Just needs time. Moved okay.

JUNIOR BITCH (9) –

1st Smith's Lypal Once Upon A Time. 17 month o/w. Have liked this bitch from the ringside and not disappointed on going over her. Super shape with flowing lines from nose to tail. Moved on an easy stride.

2nd Barker's Saregresi Iced Black Rose at Flinthill (Imp.Hun.). Really like this stylish 14 month b/w. Lovely well worked head with a sweet expression. Nicely made but as yet immature. Needs to develop in hindquarters which should come with maturity.

3rd Stilgoe's Teisgol Irinara. 16 month b/w out of a larger mould. She has a lovely shape with well angulated forequarters. Super hindquarters. Moved well.

YEARLING BITCH (7) –

1st Guy & Hinton's Carmandine Cookie Crumble by Fleurfield. Feminine 22 month o/w. Lovely head and expression. Curvaceous lines. Correct tail carried well. Good feet & pasterns. Moved well.

2nd Lowe's Lowsmoor Little Karoo. Neat 23 month b/w. Really liked her. Super ears but not the head of 1st, just lacking a little in depth of muzzle. Lovely outline. Moved well.

3rd Purdy's Medogold Puttin on the Style for Cascagnia. 22 month b/w. Liked her head and expression. Neat fine leathers. Good feet and pasterns. Low set hocks. Moved okay.

GRADUATE BITCH (3) –

1st Hewitt's Sunhouse As You Like It. Nice b/w. Not too happy in the ring. Well boned, neat tail. Pleasing head and expression. Good topline. Moved well.

2nd Best's Bestina Betty Boop. Another b/w. Well angulated fore and aft. Well boned legs. Low set hocks. Moved okay.

3rd Brooksmith's Nightgold Blackavar. B/w shown in tip top condition. Well angulated fore and aft. Very feminine head with correct leathers. She is a shade long, and flat in topline. Moved well.

POST GRADUATE BITCH (6) –

1st Smith's Fydal Ava. This feminine o/w is all Pointer. She just flows from nose to tail with curvaceous lines. All the curves are in the right places. She has a beautifully chiselled head with gentle expression. Long neck leading smoothly into well angled forequarters. Good depth of brisket and well sprung ribcage. Correct topline, well muscled hindquarters. She moves beautifully with lovely carriage and lashing tail. CC.

2nd Roberts' Woodfleet Lasoo the Moon. Feminine l/w shown in lovely condition. Well laid back shoulder with good return of upper arm. Flows through to well muscled hindquarters. Good feet and pasterns.

3rd Kelly's Fleurfield Faith of Kelval. O/w with a lovely outline. Pleasing head and eye, thin leathers. Well angulated fore and aft. Good tail carried well.

LIMIT BITCH (15) –

Another class where I could have done with several 1st prize cards. Some good bitches didn't even make the shortlist.

1st Tibbs' Somerled Classic Romance at Raigmore. O/w. Super lines. Screams Pointer at you. Lovely head and expression. Fine leathers. Neat tail. Moved well. Good feet and pasterns. Excellent depth. This one should go to the top. RCC.

2nd Simmons' Freebreeze Acadia with Galema. Quality o/w. New one to me. Super lines, liked her head and expression. Lovely sweep of stifle and width of thigh. Naughty but she did enough to gain this place.

3rd Rankine's Tenshilling Rags to Riches at Fyldefair. Another lovely o/w. Super flowing lines. Excellent reach of neck. Moved well.

OPEN BITCH (6) –

Two impressive bitches headed this class.

1st Dyer's Sh.Ch. Sharnphilly Juici Cuture. L/w with feminine head and lovely expression. Neat ears. Long arched neck. Super angles. Good tail. Moved well with reach and drive. Well handled.

2nd Siddle's Sh.Ch. Wilchrime Ice Maiden. Well known o/w. Worthy champion. Just preferred the femininity, reach of neck and flow of neck into shoulders of 1st. This bitch is so impressive on the move with perfect footfall.

3rd Wilkinson's Sh.Ch. Flinthill Forget Me Not. Ultra feminine b/w. Just my cup of tea but showing her age in front. Beautiful outline. Very pretty head and expression. Flows through from nose to tail and moved well.
