1<sup>st</sup> Yeo's Thorncross Cornish Crusade at Trexon - Quality b/w, shapely outline, lovely head & expression, clean in neck & shoulder, moved soundly using his tail. He was my best puppy dog last time I judged & I was pleased to see he has developed into a lovely well balanced dog.

2<sup>nd</sup> Smith's Toberdoney Fergus at Fydal - A particular favourite of mine, masculine with no coarseness, shown in gleaming condition, lovely head & eye, well muscled quarters, deep in chest, plenty of heart room, sound mover with lovely head carriage. ## MID LIMIT DOG

1<sup>st</sup> Edmondson & Robertshaw's Crookrise Forest - I could have watch this o/w boy move all day which I am sure he is capable of, correct head carriage & tail action, he is full of breed type & quality; lovely head & expression, not the biggest of males, but he more than makes up for this on the move, shown in hard muscled condition, just lacked a little body weight to complete the picture. Did consider him for a higher award.

2<sup>nd</sup> Milford's Haramander Bobby Dazzler - Lovely headed o/w; nicely balanced throughout, good over shoulders & neck, just could not match the movement & carriage of first.

1<sup>st</sup> Rose & Robinson's Nz Ch Robwyn Dreams Are Free at Ridanflight (imp) - Impressive o/w masculine but not course, balanced in head & nice eye & expression, moved soundly on a good stride with drive, liked his overall shape & type, he has just thickened slightly over his shoulders with age & I just preferred the overall elegance & carriage of the two younger winners from junior, I am sure his title will come soon.

#### FIELD TRIAL DOG

1<sup>ST</sup> Brophy's Ir Ch Saregresi Classic Point - Stylish o/w, beautiful head with lots of work beneath the eye, neat in ear, well developed in ribs & strength in quarters, shown in hard muscular condition, moved soundly, but a little erratic, but loved his overall type & carriage.

## **BITCHES**

First I would like to thank all exhibitors for coming to the show and apologize for not having the opportunity to talk to you all. I had been looking forward to this appointment ever since I was invited and although I found some nice bitches, I am a little concerned as to where the breed is going. The last time I judged I was worried about the muzzles which seemed to be getting shorter and shorter and now it is the tails. In most cases I have judged ignoring them as the majority of tails were carried too high.

#### **MINOR PUPPY BITCH**

1<sup>st</sup> Edmondson and Robertshaw's Crookrise Agathis - Loved the overall picture of this bitch the head though acceptable didn't impress; lovely body, good bone and angulations, excellent top line and moved effortlessly. 2<sup>nd</sup> Blackburn-Bennett's Kanix Daniella - Typical head, nice body with good depth of chest. Good bone and tail, moved well with drive.

#### **PUPPY BITCH**

1<sup>st</sup> O'Neill's Tenshilling Viva Las Vegas - The first two in this class are litter sisters out of the Portuguese import. She has a beautiful head, a nice body, good neck, front and good bone and a beautiful tail, she moved well a real classical pointer, I liked her very much.

2<sup>nd</sup> Rankine'sTenshilling Rags to Riches at Fyldefair - Typical bitch with a lovely head, topline and tail, good bone and angulations, moved well.

#### JUNIOR BITCH

1<sup>st</sup> Siddle's Wilchrimane Ice Maiden - Excellent bitch beautiful type, nice tail, angulations and good depth of brisket. Very good front, good top line leading to well set tail, good neck and she moved effortlessly. 2<sup>nd</sup> Bradley and Stilgoe's Teisgol Lady Penelope - sound honest bitch with very nice head, shown in very good condition very good mover.

#### **YEARLING BITCH**

1<sup>st</sup> Rankine's Jilony Heaven Can Wait at Fyldefair - very clean lines, very nice head and angulations, excellent movement. A quality bitch.

2<sup>nd</sup> Bradley and Stilgoe's Tiesgol Lady Penelope.

#### **MAIDEN BITCH**

1<sup>st</sup> O'Neill's Tenshilling Viva Las Vegas 2<sup>nd</sup> Stangroom's Lappakia Wannabe a Lay Dee - a very nice puppy, excellent bone and well angulated. I would like better movement.

#### **NOVICE BITCH**

1<sup>st</sup> Siddle's Wilchrimane's Ice Crystal - A well-constructed pretty bitch with a good body, well angulated, with a good head and tail.

2<sup>nd</sup> Evans & Pavey's Joneva Hazy Hazy Dream -This bitch has a good head, a good top line and bone and moves well.

## UNDER GRADUATE BITCH

1<sup>st</sup> Preece's Haramander Diamond Lil of Harvestslade - Has a typical head of the breed, an attractive classical pointer, a good size, nice tail, movement was acceptable

2<sup>nd</sup> Barford & Booth's Kanix Calypso at Kiswahili - a pretty feminine bitch with good depth of chest, and good top line. I would like more length of muzzle.

#### POST GRADUATE BITCH

1<sup>st</sup> Anderson- Rowell's Wyndhead Mette Marit - Loved the overall picture of this eye catching bitch. Correct proportions and nice size, very nice head, deep brisket, good topline and excellent movement, what else can I say about such a beautiful bitch. I was pleased to be able to award her the Res CC

2<sup>nd</sup> Gundioy Argentina Tango, another very nice bitch sired by the Portuguese import, nice type with an excellent head, good neck, well angulated and a very nice tail.

## **MID LIMIT BITCH**

1<sup>st</sup> Edmonson and Robertshaw's Crookrise Rushlight - I was a little disappointed with this class, however I found my winner which is typical of the breed, good deep chest well angulated with good bone, an excellent top line and head and she moved well

2<sup>nd</sup> Wilkinson's Flinthill Forget Me Not - A pretty 2 year old bitch, excellent head & movement, well angulated and good front.

## LIMIT BITCH

1<sup>st</sup> Stangroom's Medogold Wannabeposh For Lappakia - correct proportions and well constructed, good substance. Good head and top line, well angulated and covered the ground well.

2<sup>nd</sup> Mason's Freebreeze As You Like It - Nice 3 and a half year old feminine bitch, well constructed. Excellent top line and tail, good angulations and excellent movement.

## **OPEN BITCH**

1<sup>st</sup> Blackburn Bennett's Kanix Beatrice - An attractive bitch shown in excellent condition, a nice head, a beautiful arched neck springing cleanly from the shoulders with an elegance not often seen and excellent movement, I would prefer a better front. I have already awarded her a Res CC and it would be difficult not to give her the CC today. I just wish that she wouldn't hold her tail so high.

2<sup>nd</sup> Tobin & Moss' Davigdor Patience - Excellent head, body and angulations, but so apathetic in movement. I do so like her standing. I would so love to award this pointer a first place as she is a quality bitch but she lacks true pointer spirit.
