Recently, I read about the breed not being of high quality but I found this not to be the case at this show.

So many were of true type and so typical I was splitting hairs to make my decisions.

My CC and Best Puppy winners were all similar with perfect balance of one part to another which is so essential in this breed.

MINOR PUPPY DOG (1)

1st Thorley's Gempoint Coco Chanel. Promising puppy with a pleasing head and a kind expression with the correct shaped eye, overall a good shape. And steady on the move.

PUPPY DOG (3)

1st Siddle's Calderside If Only at Wilchrimane Well shaped head which led to a lengthy neck, balanced, in action a with good head carriage.

2nd Ingham's Calderside Play The Game Litter, brother to the winner, and very similar, in type but heavier in build, very happy on the move using his tail.

3rd Tait's Moordale Manhatton

JUNIOR DOG (5)

1st Perkins' Kanix Fate of Brent, A well balanced dog, good depth of chest, I liked his correct oval feet and lengthy pasterns, moved with a smooth action.

2nd Booth's Kanix Garfunkel, Shorter coupled than the winner but also moved well.

3rd Welch's Hookwood Only Me

YEARLING DOG (6)

1st Harrison's Millpoint Heat Wave. Correct head, with kind expression. Long neck let into well placed shoulders, deep in chest, shown in excellent condition

2nd Coombes' Wilchrimane Xsytin. This dog was obviously not used to being shown and would not stand still for a moment, but once on the move one could see his excellent balance and construction. Best of heads and expression.

3rd Tobin & Moss' Davigdor Rough and Tumble

GRADUATE DOG (3)

1st Nelis' Freebreeze Yankee Clipper Nice, Balanced head with the most kind pleasing expression denoting a very happy character. I particularly liked his small thin ears, which were fine in texture in good hard condition, moved well, enjoying his day out and had a lovely lashing tail action

2nd Coombes' Wilchrimane Xsytin.

3rd Tobin & Moss' Davigdor's Bit of Rough

POST GRADUATE DOG (4)

1st Mason's Freebreeze Figaro Typical pointer in head and expression, long neck, strong over loin, moved well.

2nd Perren's Mistin Pure Mischief, old fashioned type, good shape balanced, just preferred movement of the winner.

3rd Smith's Lypal Deeply Dippy

LIMIT DOG (9)

- 1st Theobald's Tycarreg Strangely Familyr. Not overdone in any way, very honest dog, such a kind eye, correct feet and pasterns, well placed shoulders, deep brisket, strong loin, well turned stifle, good second thigh, moved smoothly covering plenty of ground. DCC and BOB
- 2nd Tibbs' Raigmore Dusk Till Dawn. Longer in couplings than the winner, but all his parts are unison. Very smooth action with correct head carriage and covering the ground with ease RDCC
- 3rd MacManus' Luneville Harvest Moon

OPEN DOG (5)

- 1st Drake's Sh Ch Clamerkin Crystal Mountain. Balanced head with correct shape eye and expression, good depth of chest, balanced and moved soundly.
- 2nd Udale's Freddie Flintoff. Typical pointer who moves so well with his high head carriage using his tail.
- 3rd Adams' Sh Ch Ansona Simple Simon

- 1st Ingham's Calderside Amuse Bouche, very feminine, beautiful head and expression, long arched neck and good depth of chest. Overall shape pleasing and she moved with excellent head carriage, using her tail. Best Puppy.
- 2nd Tibbs' Somerled Classic Romance at Raigmore, just my type of bitch and she held everything together on the move.
- 3rd Harrison's Millpoint Hopes N'Dreams

JUNIOR BITCH (2)

- 1st Udale's Dowbiggins Olympic Gold, very feminine, elegant young bitch with typical head and kind expression. Nice tight coat and moved well.
- 2nd Bird's Kanix Gucci with Alcazar, not as feminine as first but sound on the move.

YEARLING BITCH (5)

- 1st Drake & Blandford's Ansona Queen of Hearts at Clamerkin, just what I would be looking for at this age. Well balanced, good turn of stifle and moved correctly.
- 2nd Dyer's Sharnphilly Juici Cuture, longer than one in body but overall a nice shaped bitch in good condition.
- 3rd Walton's Pointmoor Lily of the West

GRADUATE BITCH (6)

- 1st Coombes' Wilchrimane Doodlebug, loved her type. Beautiful bitch with kind expression, good feet and pasterns and so well balanced, holding this balance on her move.
- 2nd Dolman's Flinthill Golden Thyme at Zebec, loved her head and melting expression but would prefer a little bit more of her. She moved well with reach and drive.
- 3rd Smith's Fydal Ava

POST GRADUATE BITCH (9)

- 1st Siddle's Wilchrimane Maggie-Mae, RCC not a flashy bitch but so correct and good to go over and handle. Moved holding her topline and covered the ground with ease. In good hard condition.
- 2nd MacManus' Luneville Strawberry Moon, not as mature as first but liked her type and moved well.
