The Pointer Club of Scotland Championship Show Sunday 4th October 2015

It is always nice to spend time in the company of like-minded people, and this was just the case at this friendly and well run show. The venue is spacious with plenty of parking, the setting is wonderful, put this together with a friendly atmosphere & good dogs make for a wonderful day.

There are always pluses and negatives when judging, but I was pleasantly surprised & found Pointers who do our breed proud at all levels of showing.

But on the negative side, I found quite a number of exhibits who had long thin tails carried quite high and the lashing tail which is such a joy to watch on the move, was almost non-existent. A lot has been said about size recently, but to be honest this is nothing new. Size has always been a topic for discussion be it too tall or too small or shoulders too upright. I think one of the main problems is lack of balance, this was most evident, as was the lack of correct angles both front & rear. Too exaggerated leads to weakness and poor movement; too little and the exhibit looks square which a Pointer should never be, gentle curves is what we should be aiming for with sloping shoulders and well developed quarters with enough angulation for drive, but not weakness. Some exhibits lacked forward reach & a short choppy front movement is less than ideal. I found quite a few too short in rib and although you do not want a too long a dog, the length should be in the rib not the loin.

Temperaments on the whole were good with only a couple of youngsters a bit shy.

We shall never have a pointer which is perfect in everyone's eyes, but as breeders & judges we should be aware of faults as well as virtues & try to breed for improvement & not just prizes.

VETERAN DOG

1st Tibbs' RAIGMORE DUSK TILL DAWN JW CJW'09. What can I say about this lovely boy, he has always been a favourite of mine. Shown in beautiful condition, he has a lovely head & eye & such a kind expression, his carriage on the move is second to none & one of the few who used his tail. **BVIS**.

MINOR PUPPY DOG

1st BARKER'S FLINTHILL PIMPERNAL. Won this class on his more positive movement, he is quite a nice youngster just at a most awkward stage of his development, balanced head & nice length of neck moved freely.

2nd EDMONDSON & ROBERTSHAW'S CROOKRISE BLACKTHORN. Quality baby who has a super outline when stacked, nice head, long neck, preferred his shape to winner, just a little erratic on the move, but enjoying his day.

PUPPY DOG

1st TIBBS' FYDAL BEESWING AT RAIGMORE. Nice young dog, lovely head & eye, nicely balanced for a baby, moving soundly on a good stride. **BPD**

2nd BLACK'S RAIGMORE KISMET. Just a raw baby, it would be unfair to over criticize at this stage of his development, lacking depth at the moment but I am sure this will come as he matures.

JUNIOR DOG: A most disappointing class for movement

1st MACARA'S KANIX KINGDOM OVER CROMASAIG. First impression when standing was one of elegance, lovely outline when stacked, balanced in head, kind eye, long clean neck, but he is rather tall & at the moment appears narrow, needs to develop in rib & body, rather erratic in his front movement.

2nd HAZELTINE & WELCH'S JUST WILBERT. Thought this young dog could be my winner on entering the ring, lovely head & eye, super outline when standing, clean over shoulders, nice length of neck, good in rib, well developed in quarters, but he turns his stifles out when on the move which shortens his stride, needs to be moved at a different pace.

3rd WILSON'S BONNYGATE MASTER GHILLIE

YEARLING DOG

1st DYER & DYER'S SHARNPHILLY RIO VINO. I was hoping to find a well balanced dog with style & ring presence & this young dog has it in abundance, super head with slight dish, neat thin ears, slightly arched neck of good length, clean over shoulder, well developed rib & good depth, good front with correct oval bone, strength in loin & well developed quarters, moved with a lovely balance with correct carriage & tail action, I had hoped to find a star & this was it.so very pleased to award him his first **DCC & B.I.S.**

2nd LEGG & SCOTT'S NARSADS WILL TURNER SHCM. Lovely head of correct proportions, good eye placement, neat in ear, good length of neck, nice depth of body, clean in outline & free moving, a most promising youngster.

GRADUATE DOG

POST GRADUATE DOG

1st NELIS' FREEBREEZE YANKEE CLIPPER. Honest o/w male with a lovely head of good proportions, kind in eye, deep chest, correct bone & sound on the move.

2nd HUXELY'S AURICHALCUM EVAN KNOWS ITS WOODFLEET. Pleasing in head, quite a sound well muscled dog in hard condition, but lacks depth of chest, just needs to develop in body.

3rd TIBBS' RAIGMORE ASTRONOMER ROYAL

LIMIT DOG

1st HAZELTINE & UPTON'S HOOKWOOD BY GEORGE JW SHCM. Well constructed dog, clean shapely outline, fair head, nice eye & expression, good length of neck, clean over shoulder, deep in brisket, moved soundly when settled.

2nd SMITH'S FYDAL ACE. Lovely head with kind eye, neat thin ears, in firm condition, moved on a good stride, just a little loose in front.

A lovely pointer of medium size, so well balanced both standing & on the move, balanced head with soft well developed lip, clean in back scull, nice arch of neck, clean over shoulders, deep chest & strength in quarters, correct turn of stifle, moved with drive on a free stride, perhaps not just the ring presence of the younger cc winner, but a most worthy show champion, **RDCC**.

2nd BLACKBURN-BENNET & WILBERG'S CORALWOOD KANIX MR T (IMP USA). Upstanding o/w, big dog, but has balance, impressive in outline, long clean slightly arched neck into clean shoulders, deep in chest & strength in quarters & sound on the move with good drive, but for me I would like a cleaner head planes & a little more back scull.

2nd SIDDLE & SIDDLE'S WILCHRIMANE ICE MAIDEN. Another well known & exciting bitch, super shape when stacked, lovely head & eye, straight front & correct pasterns, deep in body & hocks well let down, moved with correct head & tail carriage, but today was not in the coat condition & moved a bit slack in front, I understood she was just off a litter & perhaps that was the reason, she was just not on form today.

3rd BLACKBURN-BENNET'S SH CH KANIX CHILLI. A very sound o/w girl who I felt deserved a mention in this company, she has the most striking outline both stacked & on the move, long clean neck, clean over shoulders & well developed quarters, moves so freely on a good length of stride, but for me I would like a little more length of foreface to balance her head, having said that she has a lovely eye both in colour & shape.
