I must thank the society for their kind invitation to judge at this friendly well organised show. I should also like to thank the exhibitors for their quality entry that was good numerically.

I had some difficult decisions especially in the upper classes & many lovely exhibits had to go cardless. I wished I had more red cards. I was looking for animals that were typy & balanced with the beautiful heads necessary to define this lovely breed. The Pointer needs to remain workmanlike, well muscled & with clean free action to acquire this. They must have sufficient angulation front & rear & have a gentle slope of pastern & good feet. Most of the exhibits displayed these qualities of the negative side some exhibits were plain in head with little stop & long heads with little work in them. A few were too tall & rangy & lacking in strength of body & quarters. Overall the entry was of a high standard.

VETERAN DOG (5,1a)

1st O'Neill's Ch Hurwyn Some Might Say, this dog seems to improve with age, he is very streamlined & elegant, but also has substance, his head is well proportioned, his neck long & clean with matching front & rear angulation. Body firm & well ribbed back, firm muscular quarters. He was in good condition & he moved well;

2nd Huxley's Saregresi Fame Of Gold at Woodfleet, another lovely oldie in hard muscular condition, he had a quality headpiece & dark expressive eyes, arched neck, good layback of shoulder, firm deep body & strong loin & quarters, free, sound movement using his tail;

3rd Wilkinson's Hurwyn Harris Tweed.

MINOR PUPPY DOG (4)

1st Tibbs' Raigmore Beekeeper, a top quality baby so together for one so young, his head was classy, a lovely shape & a dark expressive eye, his neck was long & arched flowing into well laid shoulder, he was good to handle in all departments, he moved positively covering the ground well & holding his shape; 2nd Tobin & Moss' Davigdor Corn Master, another classy exhibit, more mature in body, he also had a typical head with correct depth of muzzle, deep stop & dark intelligent eye, he had a clean neck, good front & rear angulation, he was in good body condition, moved well, but was unsettled, given time he will trouble the

3rd Flint's Casilex Cognac.

PUPPY DOG (8,2a)

1st Martin's Sunhouse Chips Ahoy, a very mature well grown boy, very sound & stylish, his head was masculine & well proportioned, his neck clean & arched, deep brisket, good forechest & good ribcage with firm muscular loin, his quarters were strong with good width of thigh, he moved with drive holding his shape;

2nd Walkling's Flavio Del Almojon at Kiswahili, a close decision between 1 & 2, this boy was a quality exhibit with substance & style, lovely head & expression, good head carriage, strong deep well proportioned body & muscular rear, moved well, but not so positive as 1;

3rd Adams' Millpoint Simply Smashing.

JUNIOR DOG (6)

1st O'Neill's Chesterhope Thrill Of T Chase, what an eyecatching youngster, he was very elegant & indeed was a series of graceful curves, his head was well balanced & his eyes dark & expressive, his long arched neck flowed into well laid shoulders, his body was deep & well ribbed with strength of loin & good turnoff stifle, he was in good muscular condition & had good strong limbs with oval bone, he had free ground covering movement holding his topline. RCC;

2nd Wilberg's Kanix Mario, another top flight or/w dog, very unlucky to meet 1 today, he had a lovely head, well shaped & well proportioned, his eye was dark & alert, he was a very balanced dog as with 1, good to handle in all departments, he had free driving action & was in lovely condition & was handled to advantage, one to watch;

3rd Watkins & Davies' Ansona Aladdin.

YEARLING DOG (5)

1st Stilgoe's Enzo Del Almojon through Teisgol, a very attractive boy of good breed type, not a big one but he had a lot of quality, he had a lovely headpiece with plenty of work in it & a very dark eye, he had a clean long neck, strong deep well ribbed body & muscular loin & quarters, well angulated front & rear, he was very sound & moved with style;

2nd Kirby's Pipeaway Master Design, this o/w boy was typy & elegant, his head was classical carried well on long arched neck, his body was streamlined, well ribbed, deep in brisket & strong well angulated rear, when he managed to settle he moved well covering the ground, he has to get his act together; 3rd Collins' Collholme John Paul.

NOVICE DOG (4,2)

1st Parsons' Pipeaway Hello Sunshine, a very typy or/w youngster with a gorgeous head & expression as always from this kennel, he had a long arched neck set cleanly into his well laid shoulders, good depth of brisket, strong body, loin & quarters, his angulation was good & he was lovely to handle, he had a very good outline & moved well, should trouble the best soon;

2nd Ram's Gempoint Mr Findley, an honest boy who was sound on the move, not a bad overall shape but unfortunately he was spoilt by his excess weight especially on his shoulder, I gather he has had a problem with this.

POST GRADUATE DOG (8,1)

1st O'Neill's Tenshilling Home Alone, a very honest well balanced boy who was similar to the yearling winner, super overall construction, his head was masculine & well shaped & carried proudly on a clean arched neck, excellent body & quarters with matching angulation, strong limbs with oval bone & he handled well & was a sound free mover;

2nd Lathwell's Tinchitamba A Waiting Game, this dog was very elegant & streamlined, of a different type to 1, I loved his head & eye, his neck was long & arched, good shoulder angulation & matching rear angulation, a lovely overall shape & make but needs to mature in body, he had a free ground covering movement;

3rd Turnbull's Bonnygate Marquis O'The Glen at Beridew.

LIMIT DOG (15,3)

1st Macara, Jamieson's Kanix Legend at Cromasaig, a top flight o/w, very masculine with loads of ring presence & style, he had very free ground covering movement with an excellent profile, his head was balanced carried proudly on long arched neck, good angulation front & rear, he was very honest & good to handle throughout, one with a bright future;

2nd Walkling's Aspyre Follow Your Dreams to Kiswahili, another boy with quality, totally balanced with everything in the right proportions, lovely head & expression, clean neck, good forechest, deep well ribbed body, strong short loin & muscular rear with correct angulation, he moved well, a close decision with these 2 boys;

3rd Bradley's Teisgol King Alfred at Dappledawn.

OPEN DOG (11)

1st Wheldon & Earl's Caithpoint Hot Chocolate, a l/w boy I have admired previously, today he pulled out all the stops to win a fiercely contested CC, his head was masculine & well shaped, carried well on clean arched neck, good layback of shoulder, deep brisket & well ribbed back, he was strong in loin & quarters, he moved well covering the ground well, a very well deserved win;

2nd Watkins & Davies' Sh Ch Hurwyn Law N Order, a very classy top flight boy of a different type, he oozed quality with his lovely head & his overall series of graceful curves, he was balanced throughout, lovely to handle, difficult to fault, he moved with style covering plenty of ground & was handled to advantage, a close contender;

3rd Hazeltine & Upton's Hookwood By George.

VETERAN BITCH (7,1)

1st Bastin's Hawkfield Sea Storm over Jarobede, a very good class of oldies, headed by a quality blanket/b girl, very striking & balanced, she was a lovely type with her feminine head, clean long neck set well into her long shoulder, her body was deep, firm in loin & good angulation front & rear, she moved fluently holding her shape, she didn't look her age;

2nd Craik's Scobec Pure Passion, a very elegant typy bitch who was streamlined, her head was well proportioned with a soft expression, she was totally balanced with correct angulation, she moved out well, not quite the animation of 1;

3rd Lowe's Lowsmoor Storms River.

MINOR PUPPY BITCH (5,1)

1st Siddle Siddle's Wilchrimane Frankel, a stunning o/w baby headed this class, she was eyecatching & had ring presence beyond her tender age, she was so well put together with her pretty balanced head & the darkest eye & pigmentation, her head was carried proudly on a long neck set well into her well laid shoulders, her body was firm & well ribbed with strong rear, she moved so well holding her outline, one to watch;

2nd Westron's Aurichalcum Kiss This, another o/w baby who had a lot of quality, her head was feminine & a good shape with a good stop & correct depth of muzzle, the same remarks apply as to 1, but she was not as forward, she was totally balanced & sound on the move but was unsettled, her time will come; 3rd Brookes' Pennystone Shamrock.

PUPPY BITCH (11)

1st Harrison's Millpoint Simply Scrumptus, a top flight exhibit of a different type to the previous winner, she was very well proportioned with a beautiful head & a kind expression, her neck was arched & flowed into her well laid shoulder, excellent depth of body, good forechest & strong muscular loin & quarters with good width of thigh, she showed very well with a steady ground covering stride. BPB & BP;

2nd Abbott's Millpoint Simply Sublme at Mirasol, this bitch I see was sister to 1 & displayed similar attributes, she was elegant & had flowing lines, her head was well balanced with a deep stop & dark expressive eyes, very clean in neck, well angulated rear & front & a firm body & well ribbed back, she covered plenty of ground using her quarters & lashing her tail;

3rd Williams & Kaizaki's Sunhouse Custard Cream at Lakecastle.

JUNIOR BITCH (8,3)

1st Elrington's Ansona Cinderella, a smaller quality b/w youngster, totally balanced & sound with good free ground covering movement, her head was classical, her neck long & arched & her body deep & firm with good turn of stifle & well muscled quarters, she was happy & stylish holding her shape;

2nd Gordon's Hawkfield Saunter, this bitch oozed quality & was streamlined & elegant, her head was feminine with a good eye colour for a lemon, I loved her overall shape & style when moving, she had good front & rear angulation & deep firm body, she was a good free mover & had a lovely outline, needs to settle down;

3rd Rankine's Gempoint Catch A Dream for Fyldefair.

YEARLING BITCH (12,2)

1st Evans & Pavey's Joneva Mrs Bridges, an upstanding very smart b/w girl, won this class on her overall construction, she was totally balanced & very sound on the move, her head was well shaped & feminine, her body deep with good forechest & strong loin, her quarters were well muscled with good turn of stifle, she moved out freely holding her outline;

2nd Dyer & Oddie's Sharnphilly Makybe Diva, a smaller girl of a different type, she was typy & had a classical head & a lovely eye & expression, she had a long reach neck, good shoulder & rear angulation, her body was firm & good to handle, a very extravagant ground covering movement; 3rd Gordon's Hawkfield Saunter.

NOVICE BITCH (7,4)

1st Harrison's Millpoint Simply Scrumptus;

2nd Bastin's Symitry Bright As A Button for Jarobede, this girl was still raw & has got to mature in body & grow into herself, she had a quality headpiece, clean arched neck & decent angulation, she moved soundly covering the ground well;

3rd Young's Gundioy Reflection Within.

POST GRADUATE BITCH (15,4)

1st Dyer & Oddie's Calderside Truly Unruly for Riowood, an honest workmanlike o/w girl who was very sound, well proportioned head with deep stop & dark intelligent eyes & good turn of lip, excellent head carriage, firm deep body & muscular loin & quarters, she had good front & rear angulation, strong free movement using her tail;

2nd Swannell's Sharnphilly Rio Bella, a quality bitch, very well balanced, streamlined & sound, feminine head, well shaped & expressive eye, she had a clean outline & had a free ground covering movement, she was good to handle in all departments with correct angulation, a little longer than 1, a close decision; 3rd Lowe's Lowsmoor Shiralee.

LIMIT BITCH (16,2)

1st Wheldon & Earl's Caithpoint Here And Now, this elegant o/w bitch headed a strong class of bitches both numerically & in quality. She was in no way flashy but totally filled my eye with her streamlined body & her flowing lines, her head was balanced & feminine, her neck long & arched set into her long well laid shoulders, firm body, well ribbed back & strong loin & quarters, ground covering enthusiastic movement. RCC:

2nd Parsons' Pipeaway Dolly Rocker, this b/w bitch oozed quality & breed type, her head was classical as would be expected from this kennel, she had lengthy neck, long well laid shoulders, strong deep body & good turn of stifle with good width of thigh, she had a stunning profile & moved with good length of stride, not so confident as 1;

3rd Bell's Ridanflight Runedd with Balintyne.

OPEN BITCH (6)

1st Rose's Ridanflight Rhianna, a class of top quality exhibits slightly different in type, a very streamlined girl who I liked better each time she moved her head, was of the correct proportions with a dark intelligent eye & long arched neck used to advantage, long shoulder well laid back, curvaceous firm body & strong loin & rear assembly, she excelled on the move with her free ground covering stride, holding her shape. BB & BOB;

2nd McGilp's Sh Ch Ridanflight Ruby Tuesday at Forthbourne, this girl was top flight today, totally feminine &balanced, her head was classical carried proudly on long arched neck, correct angulation front & rear & strong deep well ribbed body & well angulated quarters, strong driving action, a real showgirl & a contender for top honours;

3rd Harrison's Millpoint Hopes N'Dreams.
