## DOGS

I had a most enjoyable day judging dogs at the above show. Many thanks to my 2 stewards and to Anne for taking photos of my winners and also of course to Jenny for her official photographs. Thank you too to the exhibitors for a super entry with some lovely typey Pointers. My main area of concern was the number of wide fronts sometimes coupled with coarse shoulders, sometimes at odds with the stature of the dog. Conversely there were also a few that were very narrow in front.

### VETERAN DOG (4 Ents)

1<sup>st</sup> Philo's Fydal Caprio at Salmonmist JW SHCM OSW ShCEx VW. Elegant orange and white in lovely condition with a beautiful head. Sloping shoulders, good depth of brisket with well sprung ribs carried well back to a short strong loin. Strong well muscled quarters and a neat tail. Stylish and true on the move. BVIS  
2<sup>nd</sup> Jamieson, Macara & Blackburn-Bennett's Sh Ch Kanix Peri Peri with Glenfinnan. Well made orange of a slightly heavier mould. Lovely head. Reachy neck into sloping shoulders and a flowing outline with good depth through the brisket. Well angulated quarters. Moved freely with a good length of stride.  
3<sup>rd</sup> Gordon's Hawkfield Audacity JW (ai). Nice orange with the most beautiful head and expression. A wee bit longer cast but his brisket is well let down and he has a beautiful tail set. Well angulated quarters. Sound mover.

### MINOR PUPPY DOG (5 Ents)

1<sup>st</sup> Oliver, Oliver & Oliver's Wilchrimane Florin to Olivesong. Stylish orange with a lovely flowing outline. Slightly sloping pasterns. Clean neck into sloping shoulders. Lovely topline. Well turned stifles and a neat tail. Moved well with a decent stride.  
2<sup>nd</sup> Siddle, Siddle, Bailey & Bailey's Wilchrimane Tunaverse. Orange with a lovely head. Nice topline with a lovely tail set. Well turned stifles and neat feet. Preferred his balance of foreface to skull but was nothing like as collected on the move.  
3<sup>rd</sup> Mason's Freebreeze Noel Coward. Less mature orange with a lovely head and expression. Has a nice topline and strong quarters. Not quite the forehand which gave him a shorter stride on the move but he went truly with no exaggeration.

### **PUPPY DOG (4 Ents)**

1<sup>st</sup> O'Neill's Chesterhope Agent Orange at Carmandine (Imp NZL). Typey elegant orange with a lovely clean outline. Good head. Reachy neck flowing into sloping shoulders and a nice topline. Strong quarters with well-turned stifles and a neat tail. Is a bit of a handful on the move and his handler was having to restrain him rather and this gave the puppy bitch the edge in front movement. BPD

2<sup>nd</sup> Oliver, & Oliver's Oliver Wilchrimane Florin to Olivesong.

3<sup>rd</sup> Harrison's Millpoint Mr Loverman. Black and white with long sloping shoulders and a decent upper arm. Well boned with a good reach of neck. Well turned stifles. He is a wee bit tied at elbow and rather narrow in front but time is on his side.

### **JUNIOR DOG (7 Ents , 1 Abs)**

1<sup>st</sup> Martin & Martin's Sunhouse Quintessential. Have loved this beautiful blanket black since I first saw him. He has the most beautiful clean flowing lines and is beautifully balanced. Lovely head showing nice work with a kind expression and a dark eye. Beautiful forehand with long sloping clean shoulders with a good length of upper arm. Super topline and tail set. His well angulated quarters complement his forehand. He has a long forward reaching stride using his neat tail with a good clean fore action. He is very young and I had to think very hard but on the final go round his smooth easy stride won him the reserve CC. Time can only improve him.

2<sup>nd</sup> Siddle, Siddle & Mazzeo's Wilchrimane Cereal Killer. Neat black and white. Clean outline with well angulated shoulders and upper arm of equal length. Wee bit wide in front but has good reach of neck, a nice topline and neat feet. Well turned quarters. True mover but not quite the stride of one.

3<sup>rd</sup> Rayner, Spinks & Pringle's Collholme Mr Brown with Spinray. Liver and white who won his place on his movement going with a true footfall and a decent even stride. He has well angulated shoulders with a good length of upper arm and quarters to match. Just not the topline of above.

### **YEARLING DOG (5 Ents)**

1<sup>st</sup> Stilgoe, Stilgoe & Fox's Teisgol Sweet William JW JCH. This beautiful typey young dog just screams balance at you. However he stands, he is right and needs no pushing or pulling to get him into a shape. Every piece fits perfectly into the next piece with no exaggerations and he flows all through. Your eye is not drawn to any one part of him but to the whole picture. He has a good head with a beautiful expression, super topline and tail set and his tail is neat. His fore angulation is matched by his hind quarters which are strong. Right from the first time I saw him as a minor puppy he has had the most beautifully balanced unexaggerated movement. He goes smoothly with a good football. CC and BOS.

2<sup>nd</sup> Pearson's Ladyhawke Desert Orchid

Lemon with a lovely head and eye. Long sloping shoulders, sloping pasterns and neat feet. Good depth of brisket, well sprung ribs with good couplings and strong quarters. Not the refinement of one and was inclined to plait in front on the move.

3<sup>rd</sup> Rayner, Spinks & Pringle's Collholme Mr Brown with Spinray

### **MAIDEN DOG (5 Ents)**

1<sup>st</sup> Beston & Smith's Sonham Just Because (ai). Typey black with a clean outline. Good head. Nice reach of neck flowing into well angulated shoulders. Strong topline and a good bend of stifle. Needs time to mature on but was more collected than two on the move particularly when taken that bit faster.

2<sup>nd</sup> Dunn's Casdellda Deepest Blues. Six months black. Beautiful clean forehand with long sloping shoulders and matching upper arm. Well ribbed back with a good topline and nice tail set. Hindquarters well angulated. All over the place on the move as you would expect but had a decent length of stride.

3<sup>rd</sup> Mason's Freebreeze Noel Coward.

**NOVICE DOG** (5 Ents, 1 Abs)

1<sup>st</sup> Meadowpoint Jack O'Lantern at Pointmoor. Nicely balanced orange who stood out here particularly when handler stood him to better advantage. He has super movement with lovely reach and is true and smooth. Nice outline. Good head. Long sloping shoulders and a decent length of upper arm. Deep through the brisket. Lovely topline and tail set. Strong quarters that match his forehand.

2<sup>nd</sup> Saunders & Newton's Corotine Velvet Tuxedo. Much younger black and white who was consequently less ready. He has a nice head and balanced moderate angulation fore and aft. Just falls away a bit over the croup but has a nice spring of rib and is well coupled. Moved on an even stride.

3<sup>rd</sup> Smith, Smith & Welch's Quinners Middle Wallop. Black and white of substance. Sloping shoulders. Short and strong through the loin with strength through the quarters and a good turn of stifle. Slopes away at the croup but very true on the move with a good foot fall.

**GRADUATE DOG** (9 Ents, 3 Abs)

1<sup>st</sup> Matthews' Sonham Just The Ticket (ai) JW. Well made liver who stood away here. Lovely head and expression. Beautiful front, well laid shoulders and a clean outline. Is deep through the brisket and well ribbed back with a good topline and tail set. When taken faster he went with a decent easy stride.

2<sup>nd</sup> Ram's Jilony Zeus TAF. Nicely balanced black and white. Good head. Could have a slightly longer upper arm but his shoulders are well angulated. Good depth of brisket and nice topline. Nice turn of stifle. A little unsure but his balance won him his place.

3<sup>rd</sup> Wilcox's Harvestslade Fire And Ice through Merynjen JW. Orange with a masculine head and a nice expression. Balanced moderate angulation fore and aft. Lovely depth of brisket with big ribs and good couplings. Neat tail. Heavier in the forehand but sound and true on the move.

**POST GRADUATE DOG** (5 Ents)

1<sup>st</sup> O'Neill's Tenshilling Shboom JW. Well made black and white with beautiful movement. He is accurate and goes on an even stride with no exaggeration. Good head. Super front with sloping shoulders. Ribs are well sprung with good depth and he is short coupled. Just falls away a bit over the croup but his quarters are strong.

2<sup>nd</sup> Bush & Bush's Piasharn Rocka Rolla. Another lovely mover particularly when taken that bit faster. He is free and easy and light on his feet with no wasted effort. Nice head and a clean outline. He has balanced moderate angles. Not quite the strength of 1 but he has a good topline and is short coupled.

3<sup>rd</sup> Bell's Brent Deville's Advocate at Owlspoint (ai). Heavier made black and white with super depth through the brisket, big ribs and a strong loin. Balanced moderate angulation. He moves with an even low stride but could just do with a little more enthusiasm.

**MID LIMIT DOG** (7 Ents)

1<sup>st</sup> Marsh's Alozia Zealandia for Ratchda JW. Shortlisted for the ticket. Beautifully balanced liver and white with a lovely clean outline. He has a nice head and expression. Long sloping shoulders with a well angulated upper arm. His sweeping quarters are strong and match his forehand. He is nice on the move going with drive on a balanced stride of good length. Just needs a bit more time.

2<sup>nd</sup> Westaway & Eldridge's Bradgate Yours Truly TAF. Another balanced liver and white who pushed one all the way. Nice head. Lengthy shoulders matched by his upper arm. Good depth of brisket, short coupled with strength through the loin. Neat feet and sloping pasterns. Beautiful mover going with a good football on an even stride and no wasted effort.

3<sup>rd</sup> Martin & Martin's Sunhouse I'll Be Black (ai). Nice black and white who again pushed all the way. Lovely head, eye and expression. Sloping shoulders, lovely topline with a good tail set and nice depth of brisket. True on the move with a good footfall just not quite the drive.

**LIMIT DOG (7 Ents, 1 Abs)**

1<sup>st</sup> Webb's Tenshilling Jimmy Mack JW. Won on his movement which was clean and balanced with no exaggeration and a smooth stride. He is nicely balanced with sloping shoulders and a strong topline. Balanced head. Lovely depth of brisket, strong well turned quarters with low hocks.

2<sup>nd</sup> Allen's Dondaig Wooden Heart. Black and white with a clean outline and a lovely head. Good reach of neck. Long sloping shoulders but a tad shorter in upper arm. Lovely topline and tail set and a good turn of stifle. On the move he was rather loose at the pastern but he had a good stride.

3<sup>rd</sup> Tibbs & Tibbs' Raigmore Keep The Faith JW. Black and white with super depth of brisket. Well sprung ribs extending well back. Well angulated shoulders but a tad short in upper arm. Strong quarters. He was rather excitable in front on the move but better when taken faster and went well behind.

**OPEN DOG (6 Ents)**

1<sup>st</sup> Philo's Sunhouse Black Is Back at Salmonmist JW ShCEX OSW (ai). Shortlisted for the ticket. Typey black and white with a lovely clean outline. Lovely forehand with well angulated shoulders and a decent upper arm bringing his elbows under his body. Good forechest and a gun barrel front. Beautiful head eye and expression. He has depth through the brisket with well sprung ribs and a strong loin. His quarters are strong and he has a neat tail. He moved with style on an even stride with no exaggeration.

2<sup>nd</sup> Feichtinger's Berseydale Poker Face. Elegant black and white with a clean flowing outline. Lovely head and good reach of neck. He has balanced moderate angles fore and aft but not quite the forehand of 1. Lovely topline. Moved easily and with style, just not quite as true in front as one.

3<sup>rd</sup> Westaway's Sh Ch Teisgol Keep On Going via Penwest JW. Balanced lemon and white who excels in movement going on a balanced easy stride with no wasted effort and a super football. Lovely head. Good front. Balanced moderate angulation fore and aft. Just not the flowing outline of above.

**SPECIAL BEGINNERS DOG (6 Ents, 2 Abs)**

1<sup>st</sup> Walton's Meadowpoint Jack O'Lantern at Pointmoor.

2<sup>nd</sup> Clinton's Sonham Just Over The Moon at Oramiss (ai) JW. Striking black and white with a nice head and a reachy neck. Good depth of brisket. Shoulders are long and sloping but his upper arm is a tad shorter. Sweeping quarters. Really needs to go faster on the move as he was not striding out and was loose in pastern.

3<sup>rd</sup> Allen & Bett's Hawkfield King's Ransom. Orange and white built on a lighter mould. Clean outline. Rather straight in upper arm but his shoulders are sloping. Good head. Reachy neck into a lovely topline with a super tail set. Well turned stifles. Sound mover.

## **BITCHES**

Thank you to the Pointer Club committee and officials for putting on an excellent show and to my two hard working stewards for keeping me straight. I was delighted with my entry of Pointer bitches and it was good to see that the breed is in good heart. Tail sets seem to have improved, but feet and pasterns have not. Small round feet and upright pasterns are so wrong, without the shock absorbency the Pointer will not be fluent in movement and will in time break down. Movement was mixed, a few high steppers and flippy pasterns. Heads generally typical and a few bitches a bit on the chunkier side than I like, to me they lose their femininity. My final line up was a joy, some up and coming stars just waiting for my Open bitches to retire!

### **VETERAN BITCH (4 ent, 1 abs)**

1<sup>st</sup> Tibb's & Tibb's Raigmore Worth The Wait. 7 yr Orange and white still in her prime, pleasing head and expression all in proportion with dark eye. Correct top line and neat tail which she used on the move, good feet and pasterns. In challenge she was less positive in movement.

2<sup>nd</sup> Gordon's Hawkfield Happy. 7yr Lemon & White excels in head which is refined of medium width and correctly chiseled, full eye with soft expression. Good front and clean lines, strong hindquarters and first and second thigh. Moved better in a slower pace where her long stride could be appreciated. Just preferred couplings of 1.

3<sup>rd</sup> Oliver, Oliver & Oliver's Olivesong Kiss Chase JW.

### **MINOR PUPPY BITCH (5 ent, 1 abs)**

1<sup>st</sup> Macmanus' Freebreeze Gertrude Stein at Luneville. 7m.o. B & W Delightful youngster with a true pointer expression dark eye and feminine head good body shape and strong back end. Nothing exaggerated but balanced and as she fills her frame should be an interesting one for the future. She stood well showing her slightly sloping pasterns and moved OK given her tender age and the noisy surroundings. Unfortunately, she faded a bit in PB, her handler must encourage her on the move, no judge should mind a bit of chit chat with pups.

2<sup>nd</sup> Blake's Wilchrimane Flomotion for Sandbears NAF. 8 m.o & W put down in tip top condition, lovely head and expression and well put together her top line flowing to tail. Moved positively. Just preferred the length of foreface of 1.

3<sup>rd</sup> Nelis' Freebreeze Carla Lane.

### **PUPPY BITCH (8 ent, 2 abs)**

1<sup>st</sup> Smith's El Fydal Del Winepoint Natyave Grove (Imp CZE). 11 m.o. caught my eye as soon as she entered the ring B & W of correct proportions with a curvaceous body. Her head still needs time but has dark expressive eye, good muzzle, correct leathers. Deep in chest and correct feet and pasterns. Happy on the move using her tail best mover in class. BP & BPIS

2<sup>nd</sup> Welch & Hazeltine's Corotine Noir Blossom. 11 m.o. very pretty and feminine. Good head shape with dark eye, correct ear set. Good front and hind angulation and pasterns slightly sloping. Correct in body but a bit babyish still in movement, when she tightens up should be a contender.

3<sup>rd</sup> Macmanus' Freebreeze Gertrude Stein at Luneville.

**JUNIOR BITCH** (15 ent, 1 abs) A difficult class to judge as movement very diverse and bitches at different stages of development, however, my winner stood out.

1<sup>st</sup> Hinton, Luke & Leman's Fleurfield Betty Barclay. B & W 15 m.o very elegant youngster nicely bodied up presenting a balanced shape with good shoulders and h.q.'s and depth of chest. Correct tail and placement. Her head is full of quality and her dark eye gives a bright but kindly expression. She moves well covering the ground, I shall watch her fulfill this early promise.

2<sup>nd</sup> Siddle's Wilchrimane Hex Appeal Smart. 17 m.o. heavily marked B & W. Feminine all through with correct head shape and thin leathers and well balanced with good angles. Pipped by 1 on front stride action.

3<sup>rd</sup> Barham's Droveborough Witchy Woman JW

**YEARLING BITCH** (6 ent, 1 abs)

1<sup>st</sup> Stilgoe, Stilgoe & Fox's Teisgol Rose Champion. Loved everything about this typy young O & W, certainly stood out in this class. Presented in hard condition with good muscle tone that was lacking in others. Quality head shape with neat ears set well, dark points gave her a melting yet alert expression. Good front, bone, pasterns and feet. Moved with ease which might be helped by her handler taking a longer stride. I seriously considered her for higher honours, but she lost a bit of her sparkle in the challenge. It was a long day!

2<sup>nd</sup> Pearson's Ladyhawke Winning Colours. Well put together young lemon and white who gained her place by virtue of her kindly expression and general balance. Lacked a bit of enthusiasm on the move.

3<sup>rd</sup> Matthews' Sonham Just Good Friends (AI) JW.

**MAIDEN BITCH** (3 ent, 1a abs)

1<sup>st</sup> Smith's El Fydal Del Winepoint Natyave Grove (Imp CZE).

2<sup>nd</sup> Bush & Bush's Piasharn Annie Bonny. 14 m.o. liver and white still a lot of maturing to do in head and body but she is the right shape and good top and underline and tail set. Feet and pasterns correct and she strides out on the move. Just needs time.

**NOVICE BITCH** (4 ent, 1 abs)

1<sup>st</sup> Bush & Bush's Piasharn Annie Bonny.

2<sup>nd</sup> Eldridge's Bradgate You're Late. Upstanding lemon and white of bigger build to 1 good body shape. Refined head with chiselling under eyes and a raised occiput, fine rounded flews. Not happy on the move.

3<sup>rd</sup> Collins & Collins' Collholme Honeysuckle.

**GRADUATE BITCH** (8 ent, 1 abs)

1<sup>st</sup> Dunn's Hocus Pocus JW. Liver & white business like in appearance and movement. Deep chested good lay of shoulder and turn of stifle. Head of medium width, bright kind eye, clean neck and tight skin. Brisket well let down with oval bone correct and pasterns. One of the soundest movers today which sealed her place.

2<sup>nd</sup> Anderson-Rowell's Daledancer Frances Mullen. Shortlisted in Junior but much more relaxed in this class so able to show off her attribute much better. Not overdone in any way she is balanced fore and aft, has clean lines and forelegs straight and firm. She needs time to mature and develop and settle on the move but is a nice sort.

3<sup>rd</sup> Cobden's Alozia Zantini.

**POST GRADUATE BITCH** (6 ent, 2 abs)

1<sup>st</sup> Stilgoe & Fox's Teisgol Alohomora. Very similar to my Y.B winner from the same kennels. The best of heads full of quality and Pointer characteristics. Her dark pigmentation added to her bright eyes gave a beautiful look. She flows in shape from her head to her tail is in very hard condition with a good coat. She is balanced with good lay of shoulder and return of upper arm and has a solid hindquarter to match. She moves well when settled, work on this and I am sure she will come up trumps for you.

2<sup>nd</sup> Anderson-Rowell's Wilchrimane Silent Sonnet at Daledancer. Classy black and white unlucky to come up against 1. Classic head, clean neck and tight skin. Well muscled and although not as angled as some was balanced and held herself well on the move. I admired her character, she was enjoying herself and was as one with her handler.

3<sup>rd</sup> Bush & Bush's Piasharn Breaking the Law.

**MID LIMIT BITCH** (13 ent, 3 abs)

1<sup>st</sup> Gerrard, Bell & Galloway's Riowood C'Mon Its Time for Carmandine JW. Eye catching B & W with kind expressive dark eyes fine lip and head shape in proportion. Flowing clean lines sloping pasterns and oval feet well padded. She has lovely curves. She has a business like attitude moving with drive, her neat tail busy. I liked the stamp of her and hope she gains top honours very soon.

2<sup>nd</sup> Earl, Wheldon & Jones's Flinthill Some Like it Hot at Caithpoint. Judged as a pup last time and delighted she has fulfilled her early promise. B & W built of finer lines to 1 but very elegant and feminine. True Pointer head, refined with lovely dark eye, neat ears set on well and fine rounded flews. Nicely balanced in body and moved well. Lovely sort.

3<sup>rd</sup> Nelis' Freebreeze Special Effects JW.

**LIMIT BITCH** (10 ent, 2 abs)

1<sup>st</sup> Norbury, Ganney, & Upton's Heartbury Belaqua. There is something special about this liver and white, she always catches my eye. My notes say old school. She has a kind expression good flews and leathers. She is strong yet feminine has the necessary curves and angles, balanced throughout with a strong loin, moves like a dream smooth but with plenty of drive. Disappointed I didn't have another green card.

2<sup>nd</sup> O'Neill's Tenshilling To Sir With Love JW. O & W with jet black eyes and very dark points which gave a very attractive look, clean lines and good fore and aft. Her lines flowed and she held herself well on the move. Prefer to see her a little lighter but overall, very smart.

3<sup>rd</sup> Rayner, Spinks & Pringle's Spinray Songbird.

**OPEN BITCH** (2 ent)

Only two entered but what a headache they gave me. I will admit to having been somewhat emotional when seeing them line up, after 50 yrs in the breed it was a huge honour to judge these two fabulous examples and congratulations to their very clever breeders.

1<sup>st</sup> Siddle, Siddle & Medeiros' Sh Ch Wilchrimane Frankly Darlin. O & W who oozes quality. She is curvaceous balanced and definitely aristocratic in outline, a head that is refined with good stop and clean cheeks with a slight dish face, bright eyes set in dark pigmentation. She is clean in top line and undercarriage has good front and bone. When on the move she sparkles, looks alert and happy to be with her handler, no pussy footing here, she drives from her hind quarters and has a good forward reach. Given her athleticism and attitude, I do hope her handler works towards removing the 'Sh'. BCC and on referees' decision BIS.

2<sup>nd</sup> Gerrard, Bell & Galloway's Sh Ch Chesterhope C'Mon Over to Carmandine (Imp NZL). Another top drawer bitch very much on form. She has elegance and strength and never puts a foot wrong. I think her head is classical her expression is particularly pleasing she seems to smile from her eyes. Her coat is fine and short, her skin tight, she is clean lined all over. She has no exaggerations and fit the breed standard in all aspects. On the move she has a long driving stride, as one with her handler. RCC, her second one under me so unlucky to meet 1. RBIS

**SPECIAL WORKING GUNDOG BITCH (1 ent)**

1<sup>st</sup> Anderson-Rowell's Raigmore Limelight at Daledancer. Very attractive O & W of med size. Lovely balance, topline and tail and set. Good expression with a dark eye clean neck and body with good feet and pasterns. Has style going around holding herself well, presented in hard condition.

**SPECIAL BEGINNERS BITCH (5 ent, 2 abs)**

1<sup>st</sup> Barham's Droveborough Witchy Woman JW. Upstanding ticked liver of clean lines, strong hindquarters, deep chest and good front. Attractive head and expression. Moved well covering the ground with a long stride.

2<sup>nd</sup> Collin's Raigmore Hermia of Vabisbrae. Pretty balanced youngster built on finer lines to 1. bit fidgety but when still showed a flowing outline from her head to her tail which had a good set. Moved OK.

3<sup>rd</sup> Roberts' Kananaskis Black Bryony JW.

**GERALDINE O'DRISCOLL – judge [BITCHES]**
