BIS, BOB & DCC: Sh Ch Sharnphilly Boondoggle JW (Oddie).

RDCC: Raigmore Keep The Faith JW (Tibbs & Tibbs).

BCC: Sh Ch Wilchrimane Frankly Darlin (Siddle, Siddle & Medeiros).

RBCC: Carofel If I Had Wings JW (Guy).

BPIS & BPIB: Teisgol Aurora Borealis at Abbothagg (Wright & Stilgoe & Stilgoe & Fox).

VETERAN DOG (2)

1st Fydal Caprio at Salmonmist JW ShCM OSW ShCEX VW (Philo). Upstanding orange dog with good well balanced head. Good length of neck sitting neatly into nicely laid shoulders. Good depth of body and spring of rib carried well back. Hind quarters are well developed with a good bend of stifle, moved well with a solid topline, BVIB.

2nd Sh Ch Kanix Peri Peri with Glenfinnan (Jamieson, Macara & Blackburn-Bennett) Substantial dog who is well made, good length of neck and fore quarter construction. He has a good depth of spring of rib carried well back. Preferred the winner overall shape .and balance, moved well.

MINOR PUPPY DOG (3)

1st Chesterhope Agent Orange (O'Neill). There is a lot to like about this youngster, but he is very raw at the moment. Liked his head and super length of neck. Fore quarters are well angulated with good depth of body for his age. Hind quarters are nicely angulated with a good bend of stifle. On the move he was a little spirited at first but the more he moved the better he settled into his stride, BPD.

2nd Sunhouse Quintessential (Martin & Martin). Personally, I preferred the type of head of the winner, but it is well proportioned. He has a good length of neck and good depth of body for his age and balanced angulation, not as settled as the winner today but dog I look forward to seeing how he develops.

3rd Corotine Velvet Tuxedo (Saunders & Newton).

PUPPY DOG (6, 2)

1st Sunhouse Quintessential (Martin & Martin). Repeat.

2nd Tenshilling Hello Stranger (O'Neill). Preferred his head to the winners but preferred the winners outline both on the move and stood on the day. Liked his angulation in both fore and hind quarters and his depth of rib.

3rd Tenshilling Catch The Wind (Angus & O'Neill).

JUNIOR DOG (3, 1)

1st Lundgarth Fly The Flag JW (Booth & Oddie). Liked his overall shape and type with him having a well-proportioned head of good shape. Good length of neck leading to nicely laid shoulders but personally I would like a little more for angulation. Good depth of body with adequate spring of rib carried well back. Liked his hind quarters construction that I preferred to the 2nds.

2nd Wilchrimane Cereal Killer (Siddle, Siddle & Mazzeo) Another nicely constructed young dog with potential but on the day, I preferred the type and hind construction on the winner.

YEARLING DOG (6, 2)

1st Teisgol Calendula (Saunders & Newton). Masculine headed dog of good type with a good length of neck. He is moderately angulated throughout with him having a good depth of body and spring of rib giving him good overall width. Liked his overall shape and movement as he was the best on the move in this class.

2nd Laveto Remember When (Millett). Different type of head but still of good shape and overall proportions. Good length of neck and fore quarters angulation with a nice depth of body. On another day he could easily been the winner but on the move today he was very loose in his action.

3rd Stocksfell Soloflight (Wilkinson).

NOVICE DOG (7, 1)

1st Lundgarth Fly The Flag JW (Booth & Oddie). Repeat.

2nd Tenshilling Hello Stranger (O'Neill). Repeat.

3rd Meadowpoint Jack O'lantern at Pointmoor (Walton)

GRADUATE DOG (9, 2)

1st Tenshilling Shboom JW (O'Neill). Attractive masculine dog who has a good head that is well proportioned. Strong neck neatly sitting in a nicely laid shoulder. Liked his depth of body and substance while remaining elegant with well sprung ribs carried well back. Hind quarters are well developed with a nicely bend of stifle.

2nd Raignore Defender Of Faith (Black). There is a lot to like about this dog who is well developed and once settled you can see his quality. He is just a bit of a handful for his handler at the moment and needs to settle for them to get the best out of him. I look forward to seeing him again after a little more training.

3rd Harvestslade Fire And Ice through Merynjen JW (Wilcox).

POST GRADUATE DOG (5, 2)

1st Alozia Zealandia for Ratchda JW (Marsh). There is a lot to like about this well balanced liver & white dog. He is well angulated in both fore and hind quarters with good depth of body with ribs carried well back to a short loin. Loved him on the move as he uses his angulation to give a good ground covering action.

2nd Riowood Orange Twist (Millett). Preferred his substance to the winner but preferred the winner on the move today. Strong but well-proportioned head with a nice length of neck, Nice overall shape with good depth and spring of rib.

3rd Joneva Just Goes To Show at Errytar (Webster).

MID LIMIT DOG (5, 1)

1st Lakewinds Benchmark (Imp Aus) (Watkins) This was a very close class between two good examples of the breed This dog is well developed but still needs time to fulfil his potential. Very much liked his head and neck, fore quarters are nicely angulated. Body is deep with good well sprung ribs that is carried well back to a strong loin. Hind quarters are well angulated with a good bend of stifle, Moved well.

2nd Tenshilling Jimmy Mack JW (Webb). This dog has a lot of the same qualities as the winner with him being a little further along the line development wise but today he wasn't at all happy and didn't hold himself well either stood or on the move.

3rd Heartbury Matador JW (Norbury & Ganney).

LIMIT DOG (7, 1)

1st Raigmore Keep The Faith JW (Tibbs & Tibbs). This is a dog that excels on the move when he isn't distracted. Masculine head of good shape. Strong neck of good length leading to well constructed and angulated fore quarters. Body has a well developed chest with good depth and a well sprung ribs with them carried well back to a strong and muscular loin. Hind quarters are well developed with a good bend of stifle which was put to good use as he moved well with a smooth ground covering action. Very much liked his bone and substance while retaining his lissom appearance. Didn't put a foot wrong as he moved to perfection to win the RCC.

2nd Dondaig Wooden Heart (Allen). Unlucky to come up against the winner on such top form today. Very close decision between him and the 3rd placed dog with me preferring his fore quarters assembly today. Liked his overall shape and balanced angulation.

3rd Sunhouse Black Is Back at Salmonmist JW (ai) (Philo).

OPEN DOG (8, 1)

1st Sh Ch Sharnphilly Boondoggle JW (Oddie). There is so much to like about this masculine dog. Head is well proportioned with good chiselling under his eyes. Neck is muscular and of good length neatly sitting into well laid shoulders, with the best fore quarters angulation in the dog judging today. Well developed fore chest. correct depth of body and spring of rib that are carried well back to a short strong loin. Hind quarters are well developed with a very good expanse of first and second thigh and a good bend of stifle. Topline is solid both stood and on the move, as he moved with good parallel action with a good smooth ground covering action. Correct tail well carried, I was more than happy to award him the DCC, it was a very close decision in the Challenge, but I felt on the day he just edged BOB today. I was very happy to watch him later in the day winning BIS.

2nd Sunhouse You're Nicked (Martin). Very unlucky to come up against the winner today. There is a lot to like about this dog who is well put together with a very nice head and neck. Good depth of body and spring of rib that is carried well back to a good short loin. Hind quarters are well developed with a good bend of stifle. Moved well once settled just a little unsure of himself at first following an incident in the neighbouring ring just before I went over him. I look forwards to seeing how he develops in the future as I am sure he will be winning top honours soon.

3rd Sh Ch Carofel Wings Of Hope JW Ww23 Swiss Jch (Adams).

SPECIAL WORKING GUNDOG (2)

1st Fowington Lar Ti Dar at Deadaway (Blowers). Very much liked this bitch's beautiful head that is of good type and balance with a good length of neck. Good depth and spring of rib carried well back to a good strong and short loin, her angulation is well balanced throughout and is used to good effect as she moved well.

2nd Ger Ch Lundgarth Wild Yarrow Sgwc (Sweeney). Liked her head and neck but on the whole, I preferred the fore quarters construction of the winner today. Liked her depth of body and spring of rib, Nicely angulated hind quarters.

VETERAN BITCH (5)

1st Raigmore Worth The Wait (Tibbs & Tibbs). Feminine head of good type sitting neatly on a good length of neck. She had good depth a spring of rib carried back to a wide and strong loin. Hind quarters are nicely developed with a nice bend of stifle, and good muscularity for her age. Moved well with a good topline, BVB. Just preferred the VD in fore quarters in the challenge.

2nd Lowsmoor Half A Sixpence JW (Lowe). A bitch that I very much liked in her younger days. Stronger type of head to the winner but still of good shape and proportion. She is of nice overall shape, but I just preferred the winner on the move today.

3rd Millpoint Some Like It Hot (Swan).

MINOR PUPPY BITCH (6)

1st Corotine Noir Blossom with Hookwood (Welch & Hazeltine). A very nice but quite raw puppy. Liked her head and length of neck. She has nicely balanced angulation throughout. Bodily, she has a nice fore chest. good depth of body and adequate spring of rib for her age that are carried well back to a nice loin. Moved well, I look forwards to seeing how she develops over the next couple of years.

2nd Sunhouse Quintessence (Martin & Martin). Very close decision between these two quality puppies. Another well balanced puppy with a good overall shape and balanced angulation. Just needs time to settle as today she was very much a handful for her handler on the move.

3rd Millpoint Silver Wings (Harrison).

PUPPY BITCH (10, 1)

1st Teisgol Aurora Borealis at Abbothagg (Wright & Stilgoe & Stilgoe & Fox). The more I looked at this puppy the more I liked her. Head is well balanced and of good type. Nice length of strong neck leading to good fore quarters assembly. Good lay back of shoulder with a good return of upper arm. Liked her fore chest and depth of body. Ribs are well sprung and carried well back to a good short loin. Hind quarters are well developed for her age with a good bend of stifle. I was more than happy to award her BPB and later BPIB as I preferred her on the move compared to the BPD. I was later very happy to watch her winning BPIS.

2nd Fleurfield Betty Barclay (Hinton & Luke & Leman) Another quality puppy but I just preferred the winner in fore quarters. Good head and neck and depth of body for her age. Hindquarters are well developed with a good bend of stifle, moved well. Preferred her maturity wise to the third placed puppy.

3rd Corotine Noir Blossom with Hookwood (Welch & Hazeltine).

JUNIOR BITCH (7)

1st Droveborough Black Magic JW (Kennedy). These two bitches have a lot of the same attributes with very similar shapes. Nice feminine head that is well proportioned. Liked her depth of body and spring of rib. Hind quarters are well developed with a good bend of stifle. In the end the decision was mostly made on the move as I felt this bitch performed better in that way on the day.

2nd Raigmore Titania (Tibbs & Tibbs). Close decision with her having a lot of the similar attributes to the winner. In a way I preferred her type of head compared to the winners', but she wasn't quite an assured on the move today.

3rd Sniperay Secret Affair (Radcliffe).

YEARLING BITCH (8, 3)

1st Riowood Tick Tick Boom to Sharnphilly JW (Oddie). I could quite happily switch the top two in this class depending on performance on the day with this girl edging it today. Liked her feminine head and length of neck which sits neatly into a good lay back of shoulders. Good fore chest and fore quarters construction overall. Liked her depth of body and spring of rib which is carried well back to a strong loin. Hind quarters are nicely constructed with a good bend of stifle which she used to good effect as she was the best on the move in the class today.

2nd Ferndel Sapphire Mist over Stocksfell (Wilkinson). Another quality example of the breed who construction wise is very similar to the winner with arguably slightly better hind quarters. Personally, I slightly prefer her head in type but today she wasn't on form when on the move which gave 1st the slight edge.

3rd Riowood C'mon It's Time for Carmandine JW (Gerrard, Bell & Galloway).

NOVICE BITCH (4, 1)

1st Sniperay Secret Affair (Radcliffe). Feminine bitch with a nice head and neck. Just needs time to complete her development as she is quite raw at the moment. Liked her overall shape and balanced angulation that she put to good effect, and she moved well once settled.

2nd Millpoint Spread Your Wings over Vabisbrae (Collins). Giving a lot away in maturity to the winner with her almost half the winners age. Feminine head with a nice length of neck. Liked her overall angulation and balance, just needs time to develop and to bring herself together on the move.

3rd Hawkfield Queen Bee of Tenbrooksher (Brookes & Brookes-Tennant).

GRADUATE BITCH (7, 2)

1st Meadowpoint Hocus Pocus JW (Dunn). Liked her well-proportioned head that is neatly sitting on a good length of neck. Fore quarters are nicely developed with a nice lay back of shoulder. Good depth of body and spring of rib. Hind quarters are well developed with a good expanse of first and second thigh and bend of stifle.

2nd Lundgarth Jubilee JW (Booth). A bitch who there is a lot to like about, but she is not 100% happy. Stood she is a beautiful picture of flowing lines but as soon as she moves is sinking into herself and not making the most of her attributes. But felt she is still of high enough quality for this placing.

3rd Alozia Zantini (Cobden).

POST GRADUATE BITCH (4)

1st Sharnphilly Dizzy Blonde at Linosa (Gates). Feminine well proportioned head of good type neatly sitting on a nice length of neck. Good depth of body with a good spring of rib which is carried well back to a strong loin. Hind quarters are well developed with good first thigh and bend of stifle which was used to good effect as she moved well.

2nd Keepersfield Giselle (Cooper & Pearson). A different type of bitch but still of good quality. Well proportioned head and length of neck. Slightly preferred her in fore quarter angulation to the winner but the winner bodily. Hind quarters are nicely angulated with a nice bend of stifle.

3rd Heartbury Tormenta over Nosam JW (Mason).

MID LIMIT BITCH (11, 1)

1st Sunhouse Black T'Square One (ai) (Martin & Martin). 2 very different types of bitch, but both of good quality. Well proportioned head with a good length of neck. She is well balanced throughout with good fore and hind quarters angulation. Good depth of body with a well sprung rib that is carried well back to a strong loin. On the move I liked her overall outline and ground covering action. This is a bitch with a bright future and I look forward to seeing how she develops in the future.

2nd Tenshilling To Sir With Love JW (O'Neill). Preferred her head in type to the winner but slightly preferred the fore quarters of the winner. She does hold a good shape both stood and on the move with good depth of body and hind quarter angulation. moved well.

3rd Carmelfair Bellissima with Glenfinnan (Jamieson).

LIMIT BITCH (10, 1)

1st Carofel If I Had Wings JW (Guy). The more I looked at her the more I fell in love with her. Beautiful feminine head that is well proportioned and of good type. Good length of neck to well laid shoulder and good fore quarters in general. She has good fore chest and depth of body. Ribs are well sprung and carried well back to a good short and strong loin. Hind quarter are well developed with good first and second thigh and bend of stifle. On the move she holds her shape that is well balanced throughout with a good solid topline which was the winning factor when running off for the RCC against 2nd in Open. RCC.

2nd Stocksfell Shockwave (Wilkinson) Unlucky to come up against the winner of the class today on such top form. Different type of head but of good quality and shape. Liked her length of neck. good fore quarters construction and angulation and fore chest. She has good depth of body and spring of rib that is carried well back to a strong loin. Hind quarters are well constructed with a good bend of stifle. Wasn't at one with her handler on the move today and didn't move to her best.

3rd Codnorhawk Starlight on Moreoldglen (Boulton).

OPEN BITCH (6, 1)

1st Sh Ch Wilchrimane Frankly Darlin (Siddle, Siddle & Medeiros). 2 top quality bitches that were a pleasure to have the opportunity to judge. Beautiful feminine head of good type and proportions. Love her length of neck that is sitting neatly into well laid shoulders. She has excellent fore chest and return of upper arm. Good depth of body and spring of rib with a good short strong loin. Hind quarters are well developed with a good expanse of first and second thigh and a good bend of stifle. She has a solid topline that is held both stood and on the move as she moved with an excellent low ground covering action. In the challenge I was more than happy to award her the BCC but the limit winner and 2nd in this class did push her all the way.

2nd Sh Ch Chesterhope C'mon Over to Carmandine (Imp NZL) JW (Gerrard, Bell & Galloway). A lot of what I have written for the winner applies to this bitch as well. Slightly different type of head but still of top quality and full of femininity. sitting neatly on a good length of neck. Fore quarters are well constructed with good fore chest. lay back of shoulder and return of upper arm. Body is of good depth with a well sprung rib that is carried well back. with hind quarters well developed with a good bend of stifle. Stood she is holding a good shape but on the move, she isn't holding her topline as well as the winner.

3rd Kanix Skyfall (Blackburn-Bennett).
